Music Ministry Report

Among changes adopted in our Constitution by the congregation a year ago was a change in the name of the Worship and Music Committee to the Worship, Music and Arts Committee. It seems minor, but it has helped amplify the idea that we use all of our senses in worship, and that we want to celebrate and encourage a fuller expression of the Gospel message in worship through all of the arts whenever appropriate. We also want to make fuller use of the gifts that are present among our fellow worshippers to build up the body of Christ. My thanks to former Committee Chair Cindy June and present Chair Kristen Thornton (who is also our visual arts coordinator), as well as our Committee members, for lifting up these ideals.

I also give thanks for our talented and hard-working music staff: organist and Bell Choir director Marilyn Burgard, Junior Choir Director Betsy Perry, and Worship Choir Accompanist Hazel Rouker; the volunteer leaders in each of these ensembles; and to our Puppet Ministry and their leaders. Thanks, too, to the singers, ringers and instrumentalists in all of our ensembles who give of their time and talents on a regular basis to enhance and deepen our worship. And finally, thanks to our Sound and Video volunteers, whose behind the scenes work helps facilitate and encourage worship. They are seldom noticeable when things are going well, but we would certainly notice their absence if they weren't there.

Over the past couple of years, I've thought about becoming involved in musical leadership of the weekly Sunday School gathering time. We've had some great leadership in the past, but since there was an opening and we had a new pastor in place, the time has come. My immediate goal is to get to know the kids and make sure they get to regularly sing age appropriate songs about their faith. For the longer term, I want to begin developing some musical leadership among the kids that will lead to more regular participation in worship leadership among our youth.

Naturally, there is continuous turnover in the membership of our various ensembles and teams due to changes in life circumstances, and we always welcome new members into these groups. Please do not hesitate to ask us about becoming a part of our music and arts ministry. Our goal is to help you discover gifts you may have or that could be developed within you that will help build up the body of Christ in this place.

Much of my time during the week is involved in worship planning. This was even more so during our pastoral vacancies. My thanks to all who stepped up to assist during that time. Pastor Dave and I are continuing to work together more in this area as he settles into his role. I invite anyone who has an interest in any part of worship planning to speak with either of us about how you might participate.

Christian Education

Another year has passed and what a year of celebration!! We are continuing to work on the mentor program for our 7th and 8th graders and we are grateful for their support for our program and these young people. A big thank you also goes out to our Confirmation team who provides lessons and team building to our 7th and 8th graders each week and to our families who make this a priority in their busy schedules.

An opportunity arose to work with Rabbi Michael Shaddick from Temple Emmanuel in Grand Rapids. We were able to put together a wonderful Seder experience on Maundy Thursday for our congregation and many visitors who were also there to support the six young people who received their First Communion. Special thanks to the fellowship committee, many other volunteers who joined us for prep work and set up for our Seder, Rabbi Shaddick, Gary Sironen, and Pastor Michael Anton for facilitating a beautiful learning AND faith experience for all ages.

We continue to work on our efforts to expand the offerings of small groups here at Christ Lutheran. Our small group planning committee has been reenergized as Pastor Dave Dockweiler has joined our group and helped us to think clearly about our vision for this ministry. As a committee, we are doing a lot of research as we read resources to help us in growing this ministry. We are moving forward with some great ideas! Stay tuned for more information in 2014.

Worship and Music

Special projects in 2013 included: Upgrading the CLC website. All Worship, Music and Arts Committee members had special training for the website and sign ons for their individual pages by November. Another dedicated project involved reviewing and updating the Usher Corps duty list. Special music was chosen and performed for the 50th Anniversary celebration and the Installation service. Welcome Center

2013 was a year of perfecting the welcome center. In addition to securing many wonderful volunteers to work after both services through our participation in Rally Day, the Welcome Center and narthex itself underwent a transformation. With the new furniture we were able to position the Welcome Center in a more convenient location, add new signage consistent with other signage used in the church, and provide a great space for storing materials. Welcoming our visitors is a much more pleasant experience.

Communication with visitors

Patrick Blanchard has worked very hard to contact each visitor who signs our Guest Book, the attendance pads or pew card. A communication is sent out during the week of their visit and Patrick communicates this and the visitor's contact information to Pastor Dave for continued contact.

Sharing who we are

Early in the year we visited numerous motels and hotels in the area to make sure their church directories were updated to include CLC. We found that there was a lot of outdated information or no information at all about CLC Wyoming. Patrick took the lead on this and made the visits as well as followed up on the updating.

During VBS this summer, members of Evangelism were present to greet the visiting families. We encouraged them to sign the registry and did a follow-up by phone and mail with each family.

At the new members classes we had the opportunity to share what our committee does. This was a great opportunity to share our mission as well as to hear from aspiring members what attracted them to CLC Wyoming! What worked? They were happy to share and we learned a lot.

Moving forward

We have started having good conversations around continued outreach and inreach. This means we need to learn more about ourselves as an existing congregation and continuing to meet their faith needs, as well as learning more about our service demographics. As a result, the following is occurring and will continue under new council leadership.

- Analysis of the surrounding area demographic data is being looked at utilizing 2000 and 2010 census data.
- Continued education of the committee members through reading articles and books such as "Unbinding the Gospel" by Martha Reese.
- Reaching out to area schools and other entities to gain exposure and share the CLC story as well as to create area partners in sharing and serving the community in various ways.
- Researching and testing ways to increase the building's presence by designing new ways to present our signage and possibly create banners for seasonal announcements to the community.
- Securing more visitor parking signs and consider striping the visitor spots for greater visibility.

Also, there are conventions and classes that occur regularly, but not yearly, and it would be beneficial if the Worship & Music continuing education funds automatically rolled over each year. Jim Bachmeier cautioned against allowing this automatic roll over. He stated that no other group budget in the church works that way and it limits council's ability to allocate funds as they deem necessary.
